## FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND JUDGMENT

The plaintiff having filed a Complaint herein on the 13th day of November, 1978, objecting to the dischargeability of its debt in said proceedings; and the defendant having filed his Answer; and a hearing having been duly held on January 18, 1979, and the parties having waived oral argument and having agreed to submit the same on briefs; THE COURT FINDS:

- 1. That as provided in the Judge's decision in the divorce action, there was an allowance of \$500.00 to the plaintiff herein as attorneys' fees in said divorce action.
- 2. That it appears from an examination of all of the information relative to the divorce that said amount was awarded plaintiff and her attorneys for the purpose of assisting her in the payment of said expense as provided by Wisconsin law.
- 3. That said debt is nondischargeable under the Bank-ruptcy Act.
- 4. That the plaintiff herein has sustained its position relative to nondischargeability.

## CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

That an Order be entered determining said debt to be nondischargeable.

## JUDGMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

That the claim for attorneys' fees described in plaintiff's Complaint herein be and the same is hereby determined to be nondischargeable under the Bankruptcy Act without costs to either of the parties.
