

FINDINGS OF FACT,
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW and ORDER

The above named plaintiff having filed a complaint to determine dischargeability of a debt arising out of a child support claim in the sum of \$3,246.30 plus interest, which claim was duly assigned to the State of Wisconsin; and the defendant having answered the complaint claiming that said debt was not dischargeable by virtue of the amendment by the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act; and the matter having come on before the court; and the court having heard the arguments of counsel, and having considered the briefs of counsel and the respective positions of the parties, and being fully advised in the premises; FINDS:

1. That the debtor filed a petition for relief on June 16, 1981.
2. That a proof of claim was filed by the State of Wisconsin (Barron County) in the sum of \$3,246.30 plus interest.
3. That said claim had been assigned to the State of Wisconsin and was for child support arising out of a certain divorce action between the debtor and his former wife, Carol J. Kuehndorf.

4. That on the date of filing the petition for relief the law permitted the discharge of said debt.

5. That the debtor received his discharge on October 14, 1981.

6. That the amendment by the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 does not apply in the instant case. See Heldt v. State of South Dakota, 17 B.R. 519 (Bkrcty. D.C.S.D. 1982).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


That the court enter an order determining said debt to the State of Wisconsin for support money to be dischargeable in said proceedings.

O R D E R

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: That the claim of the State of Wisconsin in the sum of \$3,246.30 plus interest be and the same is hereby determined to be discharged in said proceedings.
