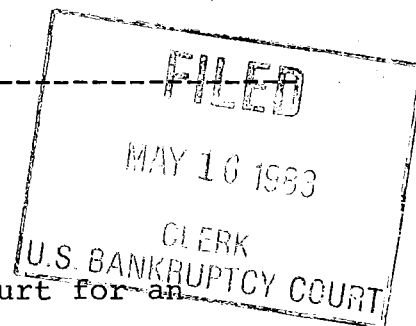

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ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION  
OF TIME TO FILE PLAN



The debtor having applied to the court for an extension of time to file its plan of reorganization up to and including August 21, 1983; and the matter having come on for hearing by a telephone conference; Menard, Inc. appearing by Joel Aberg, its attorney, and the First National Bank of Ironwood appearing by David E. McDonald, its attorney, both of which creditors having objected to any further extension and having requested a hearing on said application; and the court having heard the respective positions of the parties, the reasons submitted by the debtor for granting an extension of time, and the individual objections by Mr. Aberg and Mr. McDonald on behalf of their clients; and having considered the entire record and the previous extensions of time, FINDS:

1. That said application for an extension of time to August 21, 1983, has been made in good faith by said debtor.

2. That the swing in economic times in the building business may be a benefit to the debtor.

3. That although the objecting creditors have plausible grounds for objecting, the court concludes that an extension should be granted.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


That an order be entered granting an extension of time to August 21, 1983, for said debtor to file its plan of reorganization.

O R D E R

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: That said debtor be and it is hereby granted an extension of time to and including August 21, 1983, to file its plan of reorganization herein, without costs to any of the parties.
